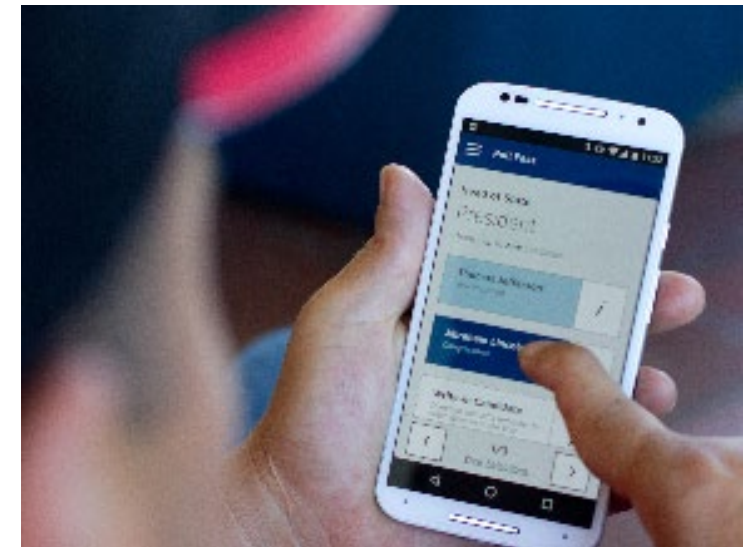
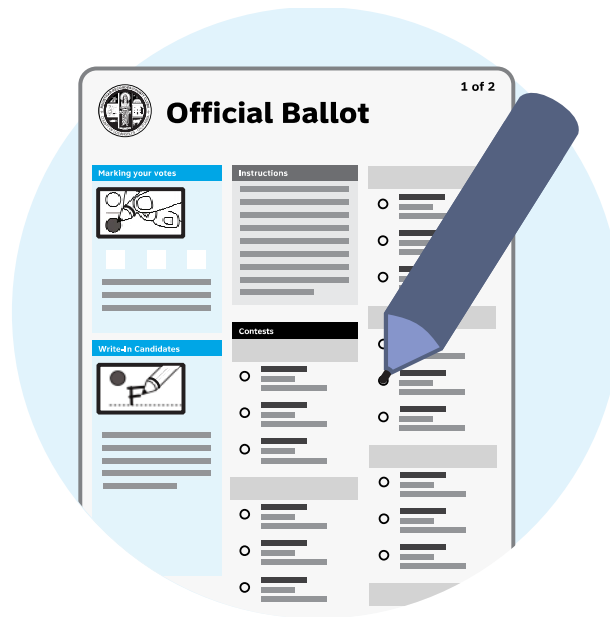

VOTING SOLUTIONS FOR ALL PEOPLE (VSAP)

The VSAP Solution consists of various system components including:

- Ballot Marking Device (BMD)
- Electronic Pollbooks (ePollbooks)
- Vote by Mail Ballot
- Interactive Sample Ballot (ISB) and Remote Accessible Vote by Mail (RAVBM)



VOTER EXPERIENCE AND SERVICES

Los Angeles County offers various options for voters to cast a ballot:

- Vote Centers
- Vote by Mail
- Ballot Drop Boxes



CALIFORNIA VOTER'S CHOICE ACT

Established by Senate Bill 450 (2016), the California Voter's Choice Act (VCA) modernizes elections in California by allowing counties to conduct elections under a model which provides greater flexibility and convenience for voters.

- Vote Centers where any voter can cast a ballot within their County
- Expanding in-person early voting
- Mailing every active registered voter a ballot
- Providing secure ballot drop box locations throughout the County



VOTE CENTERS

At any Vote Center in a participating county, a voter may do the following at any vote center:

- Vote in-person
- Vote using an accessible voting machine
- Get help and voting material in multiple languages
- Register to vote or update their voter registration
- Drop off their ballot
- Get a replacement ballot



VOTE BY MAIL

Every active, registered voter in participating counties is mailed a ballot 28 days before Election Day.

Voters have three ways to return their vote-by-mail ballots:

- Mail the ballot
- Drop the ballot in a secure ballot drop box
- Return the ballot to a vote center drop box



BALLOT DROP BOX LOCATIONS

- Ballot drop box locations provide voters with a convenient way to return their ballot
- 28 days before Election Day, there is at least one drop-off location for every 15,000 registered voters
- Ballot drop boxes are secure, accessible to voters with disabilities, and located near public transportation



MOBILE VOTE CENTERS PROGRAM

Mobile Vote Centers

- High traffic community events and County partners
- 45 Events across the County

Flex Vote Centers

- Geographically isolated voters, underserved communities, seniors, voters with disabilities, services for people experiencing homelessness.
- 90 Events across the County

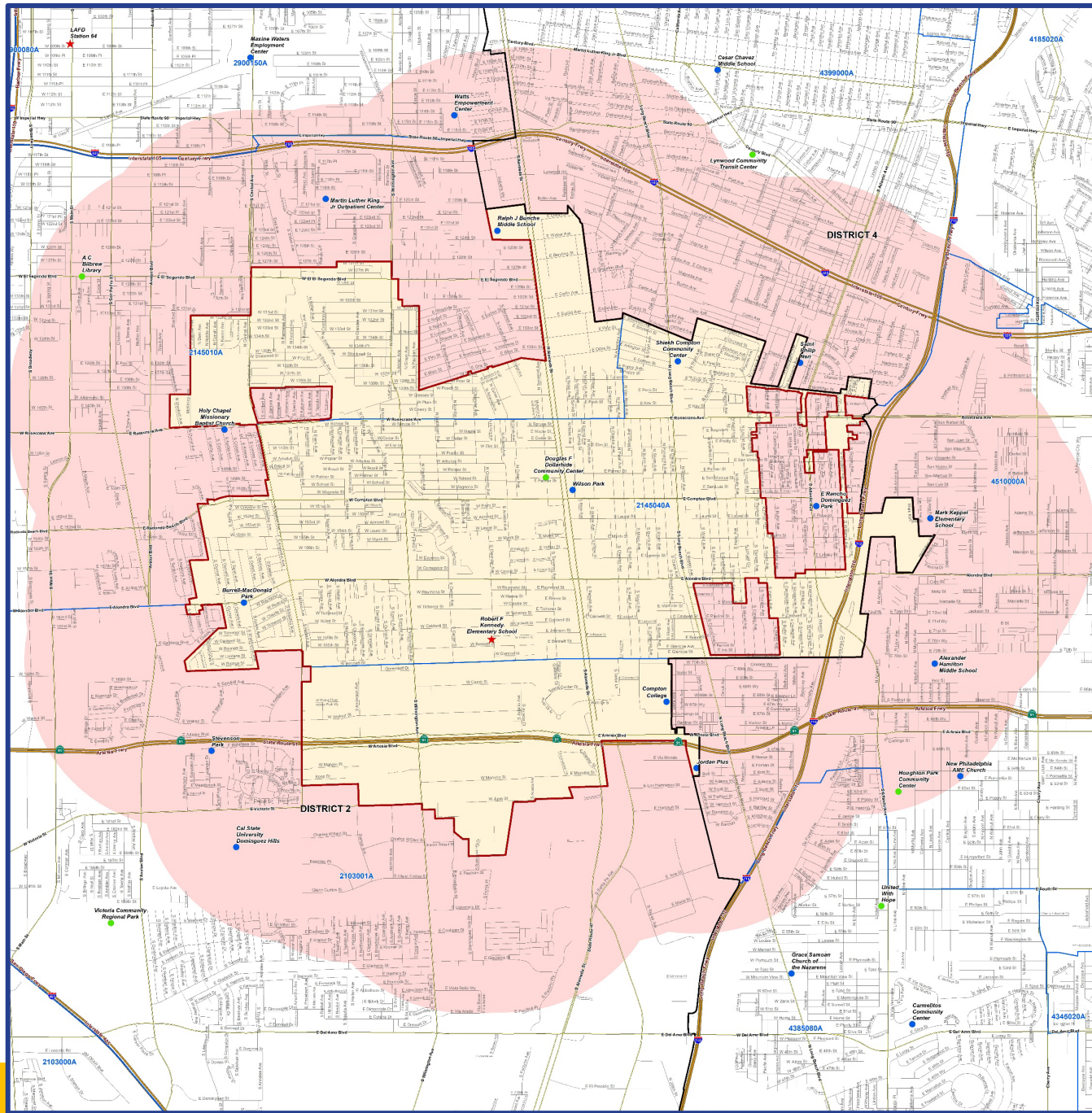


Flex Vote Center at Pitchess Detention Facility



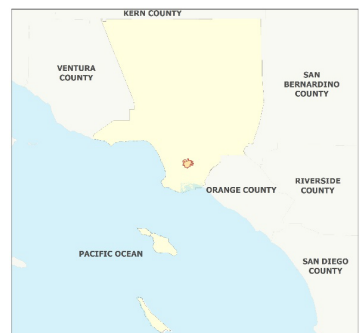

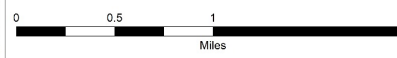

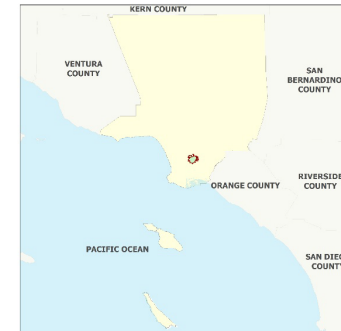

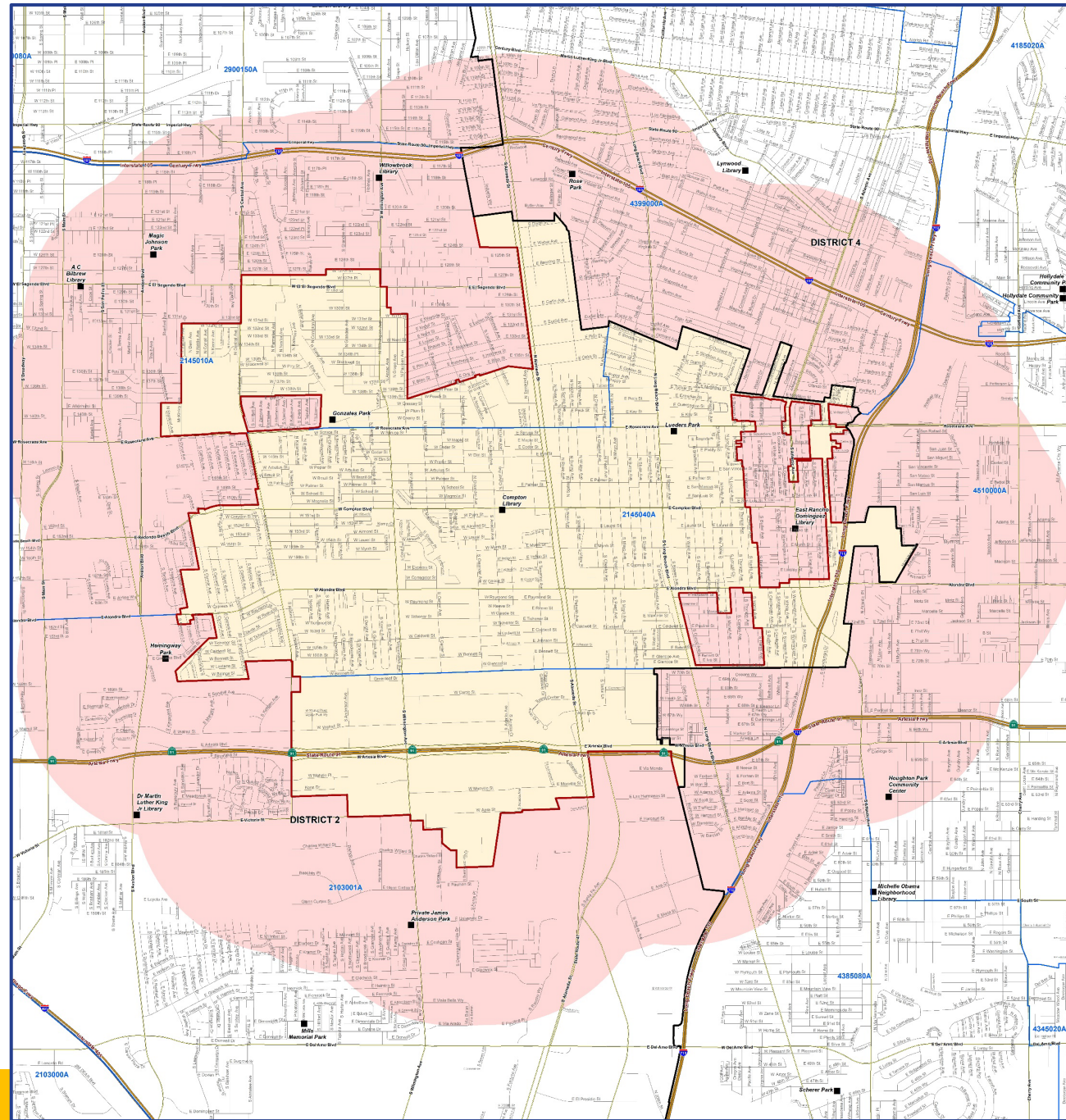

March 5th, 2024: Presidential Primary Election

KEY DATES

JAN. 25 (Th) E-40 – FEB. 13 (Tu) E-21

- **STATE VOTER INFORMATION GUIDE MAILING:** Between these dates, a voter information guide shall be mailed

FEB. 5 (M) E-29

- **MAILING OF VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS:** No later than 29 days before the day of the election, the county elections official shall begin mailing the materials required by Section 3010. (E. C. § 3001(b), 3010)

FEB. 24 (Sa) E-10

- **MAILING OF OFFICIAL SAMPLE BALLOT BOOKLETS** (Historically Commencing at E - 40) An Official Sample Ballot Booklet shall be mailed to each voter in the jurisdiction no later than 10 days before the election. (E. C. §§ 13300 – 13303)
- **VOTE CENTERS – FIRST DAY** Vote Centers open beginning 10 days prior to election day. A Vote Center election may be conducted pursuant to E. C. § 4007.



KEY DATES

MAR. 5 (Tu) 8:00 P.M.

- **ELECTION DAY ELECTION DAY** Vote Centers open 7:00 a.m., close 8:00 p.m. (E. C. §§ 1000, 1201, 14212 and 14401)
- **VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS RETURNED** Last day for Vote By Mail ballots to be received or turned in personally by the voter to the elections official's office or at any Vote Center in the county. An authorized representative may return the voted ballot under specified conditions. (E. C. §§ 3017(a) and 3020)
- Any vote by mail ballot cast under this division shall be timely cast if it is received by the voter's elections official via the United States Postal Service or a bona fide private mail delivery company no later than 7 days after election day in addition to the provisions set forth in E. C. 3020, Sections 1 and 2. (E. C. § 3020(b) Section 1 and 2)



NO PARTY PREFERENCE VOTERS

- The political party preference you selected when you last registered to vote determines which presidential candidates will be on your ballot.
- In a Presidential Primary Election, political parties determine whether voters registered with No Party Preference can vote for their party's presidential candidates. This is known as "crossover" voting.
- If you are a No Party Preference voter, you will receive a nonpartisan ballot with no presidential candidates **unless you request a party's ballot.**

Open Primary Parties

If you want to vote for U.S. President, you must request a ballot with presidential candidates from one of the following parties:

- **American Independent Party**
- **Democratic Party**
- **Libertarian Party**

Closed Primary Parties

If you want to vote for the **Green, Peace and Freedom, or Republican parties'** presidential candidates:

- You must re-register with that specific party.



POST ELECTION

MAR. 7 (Th) E+2 OFFICIAL CANVASS

- The canvass of election returns shall commence no later than the first Thursday following the election. (E. C. § 15301)
 - Processing outstanding ballots and vote-by-mail ballots
 - Processing provisional and conditional voter registration (CVR) ballots
 - State law requires the RR/CC to allow ballots postmarked on Election Day to be accepted if received by E+7



POST ELECTION

APR. 4 (Th) E+30 COMPLETION OF OFFICIAL CANVASS

- A certified statement of election results must be completed within 30 days of the election. (E. C. § 15372)
- NOTE:
 - On March 29, 2024 the RR/CC is tentatively scheduled to certify the election results.
 - On April 2, 2024 the Board of Supervisors is tentatively scheduled to declare the election officially concluded.



CONSOLIDATED ELECTIONS

- **Compton's Measure ED (2022)** moves the City's General Municipal Election to the same date as the statewide primary election
- Compton elections will be held in even-numbered years beginning in 2024
