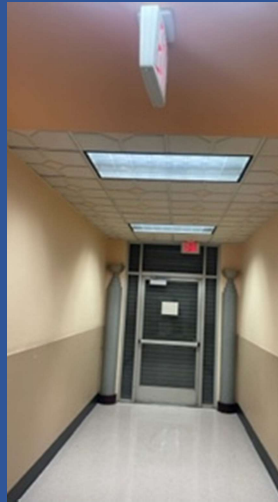

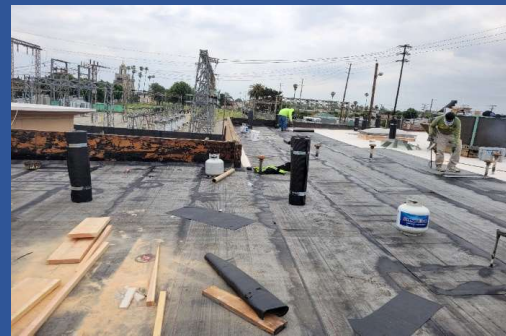

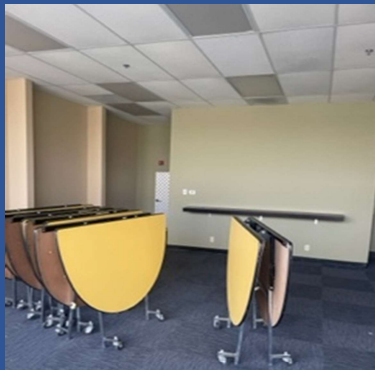

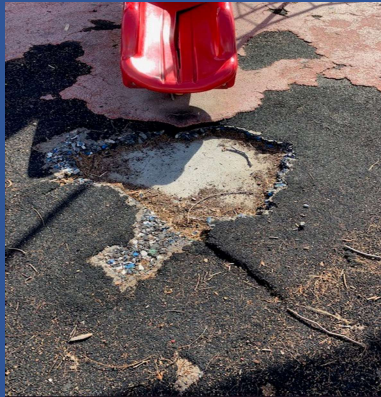
Approved Real Estate Development Projects & Agreements:

SIGN RESTORATION / REPLACEMENT PROJECT

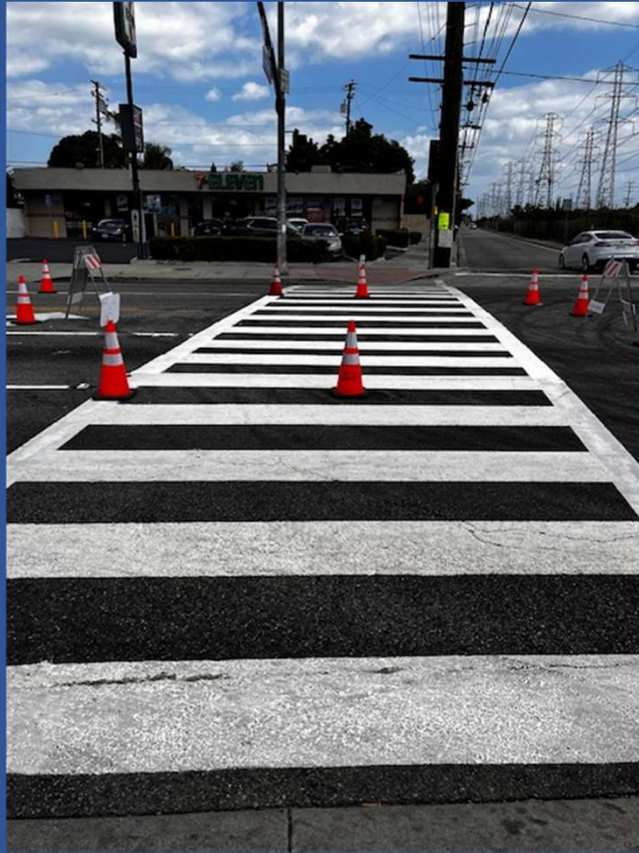


The City of Compton has engaged in a multi-phase sign restoration / replacement project which began with the restoration and implementation of regulatory signage throughout the city in 2024.

As we continue through the phases of this project you will begin to see street name signs, additional regulatory signs, and entry signage for the city.



ROAD STRIPING PROJECT



As part of our ongoing efforts to enhance the safety of our residents while simultaneously working to beautify our city we have completed the striping of crosswalks, school crosswalks, lanes, and road markings throughout the city.



GRIND AND OVERLAY PROJECT



Improving road conditions is an ongoing project for the city and many surrounding cities. We are engaged in a grind and overlay project throughout the city which will support remedying areas of concern while resurfacing and full rehabilitation is planned.



WILMINGTON AVE. PROJECT



As with the previous project, the Wilmington Ave. Safe Streets Pedestrian / Bicycle Improvement project is taking one of our major thoroughfares and completely redesigning to also include a landscaping concept. This project also includes upgrading non-ADA compliant curb ramps, damaged sidewalks, bus shelter, and raised median islands.

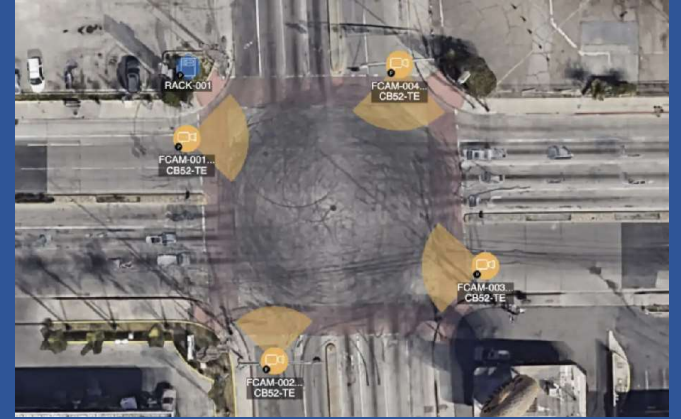

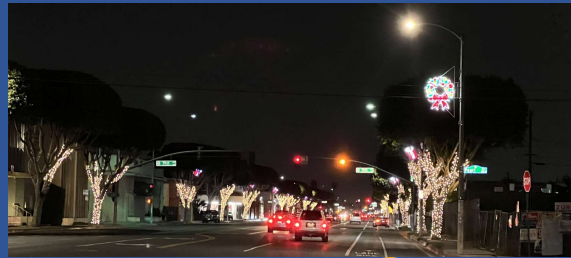
